World Corporate Governance Index*



Five groups, total 150 countries:

- 1 (scores above 80) 19 countries, none from S.E. Asia
- 2 (scores 60-80) 40 countries with 4 from S.E. Asia including Thailand; (Thailand is a leader in S.E. Asia)
- 3 41 countries
- 4 32 countries
- 5-32 countries

By wealthy elites


4) every person is subject to the law, including people who are lawmakers, law enforcement officials, and judges

What is the State of Rule of Law in Asia?

Singapore has the most accountable system in Asia followed by Japan, according to the World Justice Project. The report measures countries' adherence to the rule of law from the perspective of ordinary people and their experiences.

WSJ - Four principles for Rule of Law



1. Accountability

Government as well as private actors are accountable under the law.

2. Just Laws

Laws are clear, publicized, stable, and just; are applied evenly; and protect fundamental rights, including the security of persons and property and certain core human rights.

3. Open Government

Processes by which the laws are enacted, administered, and enforced are accessible, fair, and efficient.

4. Accessible & Impartial Dispute Resolution

Justice is delivered timely by competent, ethical, and independent representatives and neutrals who are accessible, have adequate resources, and reflect the makeup of the communities they serve.
